Genna is the School's registered nurse and is studying towards her Bachelor of Arts in International Aid and Development.

In Year 10, Genna was ready to abandon her studies but encouraged by her school Tutor, persevered. The tales of his travels through Africa inspired Genna to explore Kenya once she graduated, spending six months volunteering. With her passion ignited, at the age of 19 Genna founded *Gennarosity Abroad*, a not-for-profit organisation that provides education, skills and vocational training to women and girls in Karunga, Kenya.

Genna's first project, with the help of funds raised by Emanuel School students and staff, was to build Karunga's Emanuel Kindergarten, followed by Grandma Jenny's Training Centre, which provides literacy, language and life skills to women and children in the Kenyan community. Genna's next goal is to open a Maternity Ward and General Medical Clinic in Karunga.
