


### Special Announcement



We are delighted that all members of the Board who stood for election, have been appointed to the new Board,

which comprises Jonathan Sesel as Chairman, David Nathan as President, Anthony Holman as Vice-President, Anthony Kahn as Treasurer, Debbie Rutstein as Secretary, Shira Sebban, Anita Kornmehl, Shimon Parker and Rodney Brender.

We have extracted some highlights of the President's Report delivered at the AGM:

"The School has continued to go from strength to strength with enrolments at near capacity comprising 760 students from Preschool to Year 12.

The School's substantial building program has focused on bringing the facilities to a level that will make the learning environment an optimal one for students and teachers alike. In particular I would like to specifically acknowledge the contribution of Aron Kleinlehrer who has been a longstanding supporter of our school. His generosity coupled with the Federal Government's stimulus packages is enabling us to complete our newest and most ambitious building project for some time."

Our Principal Anne Hastings has been honoured by being invited to Chair the NSW Board of Studies K-10 Mathematics Board Curriculum Committee, which will not only advise the NSW Minister of Education on the Australian Curriculum in Mathematics but will also ensure Emanuel School is best positioned to support our students in achieving excellence in Mathematics. When the final Australian Curriculum is received from ACARA (Australian Curriculum Assessment and Reporting

Authority) towards the end of the year, this committee will also advise the NSW Board of Studies on its implementation.

Five staff members from the Kornmehl Centre Emanuel Preschool joined 380 participants from 21 countries around the world in April at an important conference in Italy, reflecting our ongoing commitment to the Reggio Emilia philosophies. The Kornmehl team will be implementing a number of new teaching concepts to ensure we remain at the forefront of education. The Board acknowledges the generosity of long-time benefactor Paul Kornmehl for funding this trip.

This year has seen tremendous progress on our journey to improve our facilities. Recently completed projects and those soon to be completed include:

- Significant expansion and refurbishment of the Wolanski Family Learning Centre (completed)
- Rebuilding of the Northern (Peace Park) boundary wall (completed)
- Landscaping at the Kornmehl Pre-school (completed)
- Refurbishment of the Staff Work Area (completed)
- Pergola over the landscaped area near the Avoca Street gate (to be completed in the July school holidays)
- New four storey Science and Primary Library Building. Our most significant project is progressing well and is expected to be open on schedule for the start of the 2011 school year.
- Permanent Avoca Street wall replacement. We are still waiting for Council Approval, but assuming this is approved as planned, we expect to have this project completed during the December school holidays.



### Schmooze with a Grandparent...

Fred and May Stein have been Emanuel School grandparents for almost a decade, with four grandchildren aged from 11 to 15 currently attending the school.

It's refreshing to find out that Fred "usually speaks for both of them." How many Jewish fathers or grandfathers can say that? But essentially, they have always been an inseparable team, building up and sharing all family responsibilities, business activities and social engagements.

Fred was born in Berlin, May in Baghdad and when they met in Sydney it was love at first sight, a perfect blend of their Ashkenazi and Sephardi backgrounds that is challenged only at Pesach!

May qualified as a book keeper in London where she became actively involved in the Zionist Youth Movement and then spent several years in London before settling with her family in Sydney.

Fred has put his hand into many ventures, from pastrycook to salesman, from commission agent to running his own importing business together with May.

One of the original members of Habonim in Sydney, Fred became very involved with Israel as a teenager. His passionate Zionism combined with a love of classical music led to one of his most rewarding lifetime interests – his involvement with the Australian Friends of the Israeli Philharmonic Orchestra.

Inspired by one of the inaugural members of the "Friends of the IPO", Fred has been totally committed to the IPO since their first Australian tour in 1966. An Honorary Life Chairman of AFIPO and Honorary Life Member of the IPO, Fred, together with May's constant support and devotion, has been actively involved in bringing the IPO to Australia six times. Last Australia Day, Fred was awarded an OAM – Order of Australia for Services to the Arts, especially through the AFIPO. Fred says "the 'M' in my OAM stands for May!"

The Steins believe that it is very important to continue their Jewish heritage and tradition. They are passionate about the links of Judaism which have been passed on through their two sons (who were amonast the first attendees at Masada College) to their four grandchildren.





As well as attending Emanuel concerts, presentation days and grandparents functions with May, last year Fred also participated in a project very close to his heart – the Year 6 Project Heritage. He said he was extremely proud of his granddaughter Ela and all the youngsters who participated so enthusiastically and respectfully and he was moved to tears by their inspiring presentation.

"We have a tremendous sense of pride in the school and feel secure in the knowledge that our Jewish life will survive and flourish through the efforts of schools such as Emanuel."
