

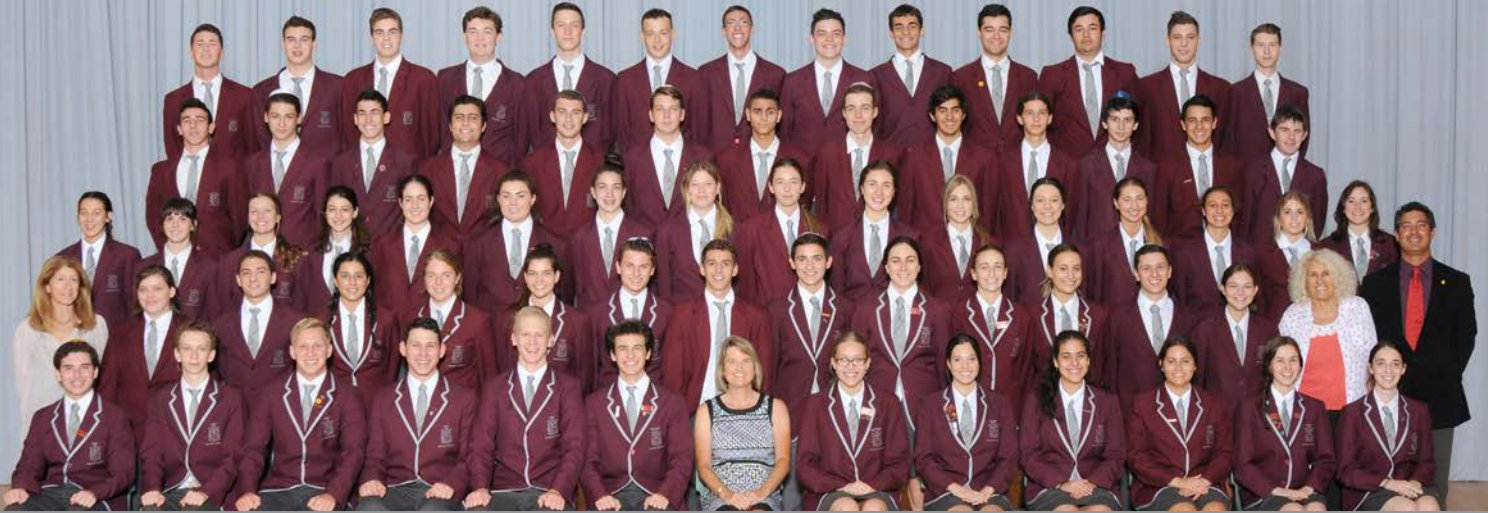

## MATTHEW (MATT) FRIEDMAN – HEAD MADRICH DRAMATIST, LEADER AND ROLE MODEL

Matthew is a charismatic leader whose passion for and talent in performing and public speaking have given him an extraordinary ability to inspire those around him.



Matt is an active dramatist who has played lead or supporting roles in many school productions. He was also nominated for Best New Talent at the 2015 Short+Sweet theatre festival for a monologue he wrote, directed and performed. He received third place, along with his debating partner, Alia

Huberman, in the 2014 National grand final of the UN Youth Australia’s Evatt Trophy, a mock United Nations-style debating competition. Matt is a strong swimmer and his 2011 Boys 50m breaststroke record of 40.03 seconds still stands.

Matt won the inaugural David Nathan Award for Commitment and Dedicated Service to Emanuel School in 2014. He completed HSC Mathematics and Mathematics Extension 1 as an accelerant, being awarded top Bands in both courses. In 2015 he received The State Parliament Member for Coogee Award for character, citizenship and scholarship, the School Drama Award and Mensch of the Year.

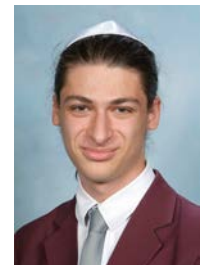

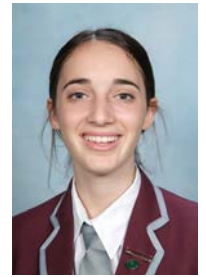


## ELLA SIMON – SZENES HOUSE JEWISH LIFE MADRICHAH PRAGMATIC PROBLEM-SOLVER

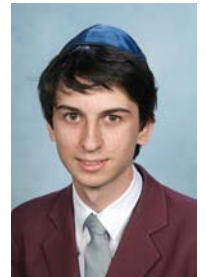


## JOSHUA (JOSH) DOUST MUSICAL MAESTRO
