


From the **Development Office**

Dear Emanuel School Alumni, Whilst some of vou have met me. this is my first formal opportunity to introduce myself to our much-valued former Emanuel

students! After completing my 1st term at Emanuel, I can confirm that our community is both welcoming and inclusive. I have consistently encountered happy, friendly, approachable young people, who are unafraid to express their ideas and opinions, as they know that they are greatly valued and cared for. Whether talking to parents, staff or students, a consistent expression of commitment to and pride in the School has emerged - and this is a very powerful and uniting force that we must treasure and maintain as we move forward. I feel very privileged to be here.

In 2002, our House system commenced, with students joining Rabin, Rashi or Szenes. In addition to being our primary vehicle for student support and wellbeing, there has been fierce but friendly competition across a range of sports and other activities. In light of our full

enrolments, we are introducing our 4th (and final!) House, which will provide further leadership opportunities and allow us to keep numbers to a maximum of 120 students in each House. The new house has been named 'Meir' in recognition of Golda Meir, teacher, kibbutznik, stateswoman and politician, who is best known as the 4th Prime Minister of Israel and the 1st woman to hold the title. The new House will be led by alumnus and now PDHPE teacher Adam Ezekiel, who was a student at the School when the 3 Houses were introduced! A student assembly was held on 13 June to welcome Meir House.

As the countdown continues for the completion of our Innovation Centre, the attractive shape and design of the façade and learning spaces is emerging. With an expected completion date of late June, much thought has been given to how we furnish our 2 MakerSpaces, D&T kitchen and classrooms, to reflect our innovative, creative and collaborative approach to learning. We are seeking to provide a contemporary, non-institutional feel, with distinct spaces to reflect, to participate





in group work or to come together as a class or extended group. The new learning spaces will be well suited to innovative practices, incorporating design thinking, enquiry-based learning and project-based learning.





Where are some of our Alumni now?

Sarah Kummerfeld

Class of 1997

What did you do after finishing Year 12? After finishing Year 12, I studied Science at Sydney Uni. From early on in high school I knew I wanted to do something science/engineering related. I was super interested in genetics and I had been hearing about the deluge of data that biology would be seeing soon. I wanted to be

part of it and that meant I was going to need to understand biology and how to manage lots of data, so I majored in Biochemistry and Computer Science.

Did you follow your field of study at the time? Overseas travel – when and where? After finishing my undergraduate degree, I wanted to stay in research, which took me to graduate school. At the time, the human genome was just being sequenced for the first time and genomics was a huge growth area. I wanted to join a lab that was using all this new data to tackle interesting problems. I moved to Cambridge (UK) to do a PhD in computational biology. My work focused on trying to understand what the newly-sequenced genome-sequence meant and how it is altered in disease. Once I finished my degree, I moved to the US for a postdoctoral fellowship on the genetics of aging at Stanford. There I met my husband who was a PhD student at Stanford and here we are still in the SF Bay Area, 12 years later with 2 kids.

What are your fondest memories of Emanuel School? There are so many! In the mid-1980s there was a path that went all the way around the school, just inside the fence. The PE teachers at the time had us run laps as a warm up and once a year they held the TES cup, a race around the school. As you can imagine, those hills were brutal! I also have great memories of the many music groups. In about 1990, Brian Strong ambitiously decided the fledgling string group should play Vivaldi's Winter. The orchestra was made up of a



dozen kids who had been playing violin maybe 2 years plus Daniel Weltlinger, who was already an excellent violinist at age 12. Mr Strong drilled us newbies (and I guess simplified the parts!?) until we had it down and Daniel did an incredible job playing the solo part which I'm sure helped prevent the audience listening too closely to the rest of the orchestra. Later in my time at Emanuel I have fond memories of the Jazz band playing gigs all over the place, from donor dinners to real estate auctions.

Are you still in touch with your group of friends from School? Only sporadically, being so far away had made it hard to keep up. I have bumped into old friends here in the Bay Area from time to time which is always so much fun.

What is your current occupation? Interests and hobbies? I am a Scientist at Genentech, a biotech company based in the San Francisco Bay Area. My group uses large datasets from clinical trials to understand human disease and identify candidate drug targets. It's a fast moving field keeping every single day interesting. I love doing research that is directly applied and being able to see first-hand how the medicines we develop help patients. A recent highlight for me was meeting a young Rheumatoid Arthritis patient whose life was changed by one of the drugs I worked on.

When I'm not working or chasing after my kids, I am usually running. I was a late bloomer when it came to athletics. After being the most un-athletic kid in my class at Emanuel, I discovered cross country running and track while in Cambridge and was hooked. I also still play the violin in amateur orchestras just for fun.

Future plans? My immediate future plan is to move back to Sydney! I will be moving with my family this July to take up a position at the Garvan Institute as Head of Translational Genomics. My kids will be going to Emanuel, Hannah at Kornmehl and Benjamin in Year 1. I can't wait!

Michael Weiss Class of 2004

What did you do after finishing Year 12? After school I went straight to university. There I got very involved in student politics and Jewish cultural life. After that I went into work, first at American Express, then at PwC in London and now at British Telecom.





Along the way I was shaped by key events. I came out, had testicular cancer twice and moved to London. These events were all very challenging in different ways, but they made me grow and so I am the better for it. Now I'm due to marry my fiancé Aaron in July 2018.

Did you follow your field of study at the time? Yes, because I always knew what I wanted to do with my career. I was very lucky. The business of technology interested me, and still does. So that is what I studied and they're the kinds of business roles I have now.

What are your fondest memories of Emanuel School? It was more a feeling than any particular event. I was very shy but I was nurtured and included. In that way Emanuel was the best school for me. For example, I didn't have the courage to stand for election to the student council, but my house tutor Mr Francis encouraged me to run for it. I asked people in my tutor group and they voted for me. As a result I was elected, and that also helped me gain support to become a prefect. It really boosted my self-confidence and I am very grateful.

Are you still in touch with your group of friends from School? Yes, about half a dozen friends. We've stayed in close contact since graduating in 2004. It's been more difficult since I moved away, but we make an effort whenever I return home to Sydney.

Overseas travel - when and where? I travel extensively. My first business trip was to Kuala Lumpur and that led me to discover backpacking in Asia. Subsequently I've been all over, along with many visits to Israel and Europe. The possibility of a weekend away in Europe never ceases to amaze. It takes us away from the hectic city life. London is a destination but it is

also a home, along with Sydney.

What is your current occupation? Interests and hobbies?

At British Telecom I work as a senior manager in strategy & transformation. BT is much like Telstra, but in the UK, so it's challenging but also very interesting. I like the strategic nature of the work dealing with some of the company's biggest challenges and working with people from all over the world.

Whereas I was quite unfit and arguably lazy at school, I now do gruelling military fitness classes plus the gym. Having had cancer I don't take health for granted, and being active is very rewarding and cherished. Outside of that I volunteer at my London shul's homeless shelter and am seeking more ways to better help my local community.

Future plans? Aaron and I will get married in July. It's the key event on the horizon. Aaron has good values, is hardworking and he is a Jewish doctor. I'm very lucky to have found him.

Aliza Hofbauer (Denenberg)

Class of 2000

I interviewed Aliza for the newsletter just over 6 years ago. Interestingly, her thoughts on life after school and memories of her school-days are far more vivid in this interview now. Parenthood and career changes are just part of one's life journey...

"After I finished School in 2000. I went on Shnat with Netzer - this consisted of 4 months on a leadership program, 'Machon', based in Jerusalem, 6 weeks of leading on a summer camp for American and Israeli kids. called 'machine Shimshon' based on kibbutz between Jerusalem and Tel Aviv, 2 weeks volunteering on a tourist archaeological dig and living in an apartment in Jerusalem and 3 months living and working on a kibbutz near Eilat.... I highly recommend the program to anvone/evervone who can go and hope it still exists in some form so my kids can go on it. I then travelled around Europe for 2 months with friends and spent time with my grandparents and family in the UK. It was pretty much a life changing year all in all.

I have to say that most of my memories of my time at Emanuel School are positive ones – I had a great time at school. I was there for 13 years and it pretty much became my second home. We really had a lot of fun over the years. I do have a pretty good memory and have many, many stories from over my years there. Most of my memories involve the great personalities we had in our year and of course the close friends I had growing up there. A lot of them also involve the teacherstheir eccentricities and the care and support and laughs they provided over the years.

Some stand-out memories though include: Earlier: playing dummy disease (some version of tip as far as I remember) at recess and lunch; taking home the class guinea pigs over the weekend; the annual MS readathon and crazy olympics (I cannot remember their proper name); Frosty Fruits, mammee noodles and macaroni and cheese from Gaby's tuck shop; painting a giant dinosaur mural on the wall; Assembly in M11; our Year 6 graduation; Library with Mr Jones. Later: French class with Miss Webb and her frog puppet; the many swimming and running carnivals; Purim dress up days; fashion parades; watching movies in Mrs Markovics'





history classes; D&T and hospitality with Miss Olovitz; shenanigans in the Year 12 demountable locker room.

Even as I write this I can't help laughing and thinking of more and more stories.

I went away after school with my high school bestie Stanya who was at Emanuel since Year 3 and we still remain just as close and now we are lucky enough that our husbands and kids are just as close too. I rekindled my friendship after school with my best friend from Primary School at Emanuel, Lea, and now our families are great friends.

I am in touch with others from school too and always love running into those from Emanuel around the place.

When asked the questions what is my current occupation? Interests and hobbies? I'd have to say my main occupation, hobby and interest right now is being a mum – I have a 5-year-old son, Sammy and 18-month-old daughter, Abi and they definitely keep me on my toes. We have also been looking after a girl once a month for the last 9 years. Originally this was in a respite care arrangement but now just because we all have a relationship with her.

I studied Social Work at UNSW and my Masters in Social Work through Charles Sturt University in SA, and have worked for the last 8 years at the City of Sydney Council. I have done a few jobs there, but currently work as Senior Social Programs Officer. This involves developing and managing programs designed to improve the social wellbeing and resilience of the local community. My interest and background is with young people aged 12-18 as I worked as an Adolescent Counsellor after finishing university and then ran a Youth Centre in Pyrmont, so most of the programs I work on are targeted at that age group.

My 3rd job at the moment is working behind the scenes and the odd shift here and there at my husband's cafe bar in the city called Bandit's Roost, It's in Sussex Lane near Wynyard Station and specialises in coffee and whiskey and also has an awesome

menu designed by the guys at Lox Stock and Barrel in Bondi. So it has yum NY deli style food. My husband, Adam, previously worked at this same site running a business called Shirt Bar with partners and recently we decided to take it over, lose the shirts and give it a revamp. The name is actually from a photograph that I stumbled acrossbased in the slums of lower east side NYC - it was taken in the late 19th century and Theodore Roosevelt came across the photo and said that it was this picture, the Bandit's Roost, that inspired him to improve the conditions for people living in poverty - so that's me trying to incorporate my social work background into the bar. It also links in to the NY deli theme food. I am gradually learning some social media, graphic design and drink pouring skills needed to help with stuff around the bar but boy is it a different world to social work!

As for hobbies and interests, I have always had a love for swimming and various exercise and I try to set a challenge every year to complete (usually I rope my Dad, who is now a personal trainer, into doing it with me too). We have done runs, triathlons, ocean and harbour swims, skiing etc over the years. He drew the line at tough-mudder though, so I had to do that with a friend.

A recent new family hobby is camping and we now have a great camping posse with whom we go away regularly. Even my 18-month-old daughter has been camping 3 times (including when she was 6 weeks old)

Travelling in general has always been an interest of mine and my family (perhaps why my mum is a travel agent). My husband and I went away for a year in 2008 and travelled around South and Central America. We have done many trips before and after that though and even if it is just a weekend getaway to a farm stay or our friend's holiday house at Hyams Beach, we try to go on these adventures as often as possible. Our next big trip is to Sri Lanka for 2 weeks over New Year to meet my family from the UK.

Future plans? I love making plans but at the moment, with 2 young kids and a new business it's a bit hard. So growing Bandit's Roost would probably be priority # 1...
