

Emanuel School - Music Scholarships 2023

Before applying for a Music Scholarship, please read very carefully the following information about the selection process, eligibility criteria and annual review conditions.

A Year 7 Music Scholarship is available to students **entering Year 7 in 2023** who, in addition to performing well in academic scholarship testing, demonstrate exceptionally advanced performance skills on at least one instrument or voice. External candidates are invited to apply as well as students already enrolled at Emanuel School.

A Year 9 Music Scholarship is available **for existing Emanuel students only** who will be **entering Year 9 in 2023** and who demonstrate exceptionally advanced performance skills on at least one instrument or voice and who have made an active contribution to extra-curricular music at Emanuel School through consistent commitment to music ensembles and participation in performance events. As this Scholarship is only open to internal candidates, these applicants will not need to sit the ACER Academic Test.

The scholarships provide for up to 50% of academic tuition fees for the remainder of the student's secondary schooling, depending upon availability and subject to the Music Scholarship Annual Review Conditions listed below. The scholarship does not cover private music tuition, compulsory fees, subject levies, textbooks or uniforms.

Applicants for a Year 7 2023 Music Scholarship at Emanuel School, must do the following:

1. Complete this online [Y7 Music Scholarship application form](#) by Tuesday 25 January 2022, providing detailed information about the candidate's musical accomplishments and interests. The information on this form is used to assess whether the candidate would meet our Music Scholarship Criteria*.
2. All candidates will be advised by email on 31 January 2022 confirming whether or not they will be invited for audition.
3. Candidates for the Y7 Music Scholarship who are invited for audition must also sit the ACER Academic Test. To register for ACER Academic Testing, [click here](#) by the deadline of 2 February 2022. For the Music Scholarship, you do not need to register for this until we have confirmed you will be invited to audition.
4. The ACER test would be held at Emanuel School on Wednesday 9 February 2022.
5. Candidates invited for audition would attend the Music Scholarship Test and Audition on Monday 7 March 2022.

Applicants for a Year 9 2023 Music Scholarship at Emanuel School, must do the following:

1. Complete this [Y9 Music Scholarship application form](#) by Tuesday 25 January 2022, providing detailed information about the candidate's musical accomplishments and interests. The information on this form is used to assess whether the candidate would meet our Music Scholarship Criteria*.
2. All candidates will be advised by email on 31 January 2022 confirming whether or not they will be invited for audition.
3. Candidates invited for audition would attend the Music Scholarship Test and Audition on Monday 7 March 2022.

*Note: Not all Music Scholarship applicants will be invited to participate in the Music Scholarship Test and Audition.

Music Scholarship Criteria

To be eligible for audition and testing for the Music Scholarship, applicants will:

1. be entering Year 7 or Year 9 in 2023
2. be able to demonstrate exceptionally advanced performance skills on at least one instrument or voice.

The following minimum ability levels would indicate suitability for the audition:

- woodwind, brass, violin, viola, cello, voice, guitar, percussion – AMEB Grade 4 (Year 7) and Grade 6 (Year 9)
- double bass – AMEB Grade 3 (Year 7) and Grade 5 (Year 9)
- piano – AMEB Grade 5 (Year 7) and Grade 6 (Year 9)

The following difficulty levels for the music theory test are a guide:

- Year 7 - AMEB Music Theory Grade 2
- Year 9 - AMEB Music Theory Grade 3

Music Scholarship Annual Review Conditions

- selection of Elective Music as a course of study in Year 9 and 10
- selection of Music 1 or Music 2 as a course of study in Year 11 and 12
- active contribution to extra-curricular music through consistent commitment to music ensembles

and participation in performance events

- attendance at the annual Music Camp
- continued academic effort in all subjects, as assessed by teachers
- appropriate conduct including observing the School rules
- positive participation in the wider life of the School
