

ROLE DESCRIPTION HEAD OF LIBRARY & INFORMATION SERVICES (K-6)

Role Purpose

We see our library as the hub of learning and connection for the Primary School. The Head of Library & Information Services (K-6) will support staff and students to access information relating to the curriculum and foster a love of reading and learning.

The Head of Library & Information Services (K-6) will teach library lessons across P-6 and be a key member of the Primary Academic team, working closely with the Director of Studies K-6 and Coordinator of Innovation K-6 to align library, information services and ICT integration with learning across the curriculum.

This is a full time, permanent position and receives a Coordinator 1 Allowance. This is a leadership position that sits on the Primary School Executive team.

Reporting Lines

The Head of Library & Information Services (K-6) reports to the Head of Primary and the Director of Studies K-6, and has one direct report, the Library Assistant (K-6).

Responsibilities

The Head of Library & Information Services (K-6) is required to:

- Teaching and Learning
 - Enable a significant portion of the English syllabus content across K-6 with a specific focus on the form, features and structure of print, visual, media and multimedia texts
 - Provide the students with recommendations of quality, age appropriate literature and actively promote and foster their love of reading
 - Teaching students from Preschool to Year 6 including some extension reading groups.

Management

- Coordinate and keep current the range of library facilities including print and digital resources for students as well as teacher resources
- Take responsibility for the school's physical and digital learning space where reading, inquiry, research, thinking, imagination and creativity are central to learning and teaching
- Manage the library budget and adhere to School purchasing policies

Leadership and collaboration

- Lead and provide services and programs developed collaboratively with the Head of Primary,
 Director of Studies, Stage Coordinators, Heads of Departments and teaching colleagues,
 including the professional development of staff
- Be a leader within the Primary School, assisting and collaborating with colleagues as required to achieve curriculum objectives
- Be future-focused with an appreciation of emerging trends in education, technology and librarianship

Community engagement

- Encompass programming, collection development and outreach efforts that welcome diverse cultural, linguistic, indigenous and other unique groups into the school library
- Acknowledge the importance of families in the education of their children and the value of intergenerational transfer of knowledge
- Liaise with other library leaders in the broader community

Promotion of Library Services

 Promote the library within the school community and find new and engaging ways for students to interact and engage with the library and its services e.g introduction of clubs, book fairs, book week celebrations, interaction with parents, guest speakers and authors

Qualifications and Experience

The qualifications and experience required for this position are:

- Formal qualifications in education and librarianship or equivalent
- Experience in a similar role and / or school environment
- Hold a valid Working With Children Check (WWCC) in accordance with the Child Protection (Working with Children) Act 2012.

Skills Required

The desired attributes for this position include:

- A passion for, and a deep understanding of, what constitutes quality literature
- An extensive knowledge of a wide range of genres suitable for close study or simply reading for pleasure
- An extensive knowledge of relevant areas of the K-6 curriculum, particularly as it pertains to English, literacy, ICT and Information Services.
- The ability to promote these to staff, students and the wider school community
- The ability to communicate clearly and openly, forming positive working relationships
- Inspired leadership with focus on growth and development of themselves and others
- Demonstrated ability to bring passion, creativity, innovation and initiative to a school setting
- Excellent interpersonal skills and can build positive relationships with staff, students and parents
- A forward-thinker who can create and execute a clear vision for the library in conjunction with the Primary team
- A solid understanding of digital resources and how to use them.

The successful applicant will be a member of the school's teaching community and as such, will participate in the regular life of the school. He/she will undertake other duties of a teacher such as those in relation to pastoral care, supervision of students, extra-curricular activities etc, as required by the Principal.
